- ^ A ^ followed by a letter indicates that the letter was superscripted.
- * Names were transcribed as seen regardless of spelling.
- * Passenger numbers assigned by transcriber for search purpose.
- * Occupations were listed vertically as "farmers, mechanics and labourers" and therefore that column is not shown.
- * All passengers come from Ireland and intended to reside in the U.S. so these columns are not shown.

77 Surname difficult to read.
 106 Surname may be Doughtry
 152-154 No surnames or ditto marks seen but may be same surname as for 151, namely Annon.
 156 Last few letters in surname difficult to read. Name may be M'cMann.
 159 Age and occupation very difficult to read.
 170 Surname difficult to read as letters look like they were made with a brush, i.e. letters were very thick.
 181 No surname, may be M'cClintock.

196 Name written in right hand column: "Mary Ann Pinkerton", significance unknown.
